Subject: AGREEMENT IN RE: GC-IRMS EXPERT

Dear Messrs. Brunet, Campbell and McLaren:

Pursuant to the order of the Panel, the parties have met and conferred with respect to the recommendation of a mutually acceptable expert to be retained by the Panel. The parties have agreed upon Rodrigo Aguilera, Ph.D. Dr. Aguilera is currently at the House Ear Institute and resides in Los Angeles. He may be reached at (213) 989 7406. USADA has a consulting agreement in place with Dr. Aguilera that arose out of USADA's intent to use him as a consulting or testifying witness, but no confidential information has yet been shared with him, according to USADA. USADA has agreed to void its consulting agreement. Further, we request the Panel inquire whether Dr. Aguilera has any outstanding grant applications with USADA. If so, respondent reserves the right to withdraw its consent to Dr. Aguilera.

During this call, it further became clear to the parties that it is possible that the panel will require another expert who is familiar with the Isoprime instrument who can remove the electronic data files from the LNDD system to perform the suggested operations. The parties suggest that in its call with Dr. Aguilera that the panel inquire as to whether Dr. Aguilera believes such a computer forensic expert is necessary. Respondent and USADA believe that the preferable way to conduct this analysis is to remove the EDFs from the LNDD's system in France so that the operations can be performed outside of France by Dr. Aguilera at a location convenient to him, thereby saving on travel time, cost and imposition on Dr. Aguilera.

During this call, it also became clear that the precise scope of the expert, whether it be Dr. Aguilera or some other expert, remains undefined. It is respondent's position that the Panel should retain its ability to make decisions that involve scientific conclusions, as many of those decisions are fact specific to the individual circumstances presented here. Although Dr. Aguilera is experienced in the field of carbon isotope testing, only the Panel will have the full range of facts before it.

Lastly, the parties were unable to agree as to the location of the retesting. Per the Panel's suggestion, we request an audience with the Panel to discuss this matter at the Panel's earliest convenience.
